“Mapping all of the storm drain outfalls is a very important project for the town,” said Durham Town Engineer David Cedarholm. “Not only do we need to meet the requirements of the Environmental Protection Agency, but they all eventually drain into the Great Bay Estuary and we want to be able to monitor them more closely.”
